Course title: Elementary Practical French II

Course description:

This course is part II of “Practical French”. It continues and completes the program started in Elementary Practical French. Through authentic/authentic style dialogues and texts, students are presented various real life situations. They listen and read in class, get explanations and practice. They then produce similar structures in writing and orally, using the acquired vocabulary and grammar. In a parallel direction, they are given a choice of themes to work on according to their immediate needs or wishes. French culture is omnipresent in the method and includes French songs, history, geography etc... Progressive learning of grammar and conjugation gives the students all basics tools for further learning.

Course objectives:

By the end of the course, the student will be able to:

- Understand and communicate both orally and in writing in various practical situations
- Know enough vocabulary and grammar for getting around in a French speaking country
- Use the past and future tenses, pronouns, comparison
- Understand basic French culture and society
- Identify various French accents
