## Tuition and Fees per Semester

### Fall 2010 – Spring 2011

#### Application Fee

When students submit their application, they must include a non-refundable fee of 50.00 Euro (€). This fee is also applicable to Study Abroad students.

#### Tuition and Fees for Full-time Students

Full-time Bachelor's degree students take 4 to 5 courses per semester. Tuition and appropriate fees, as shown below, are payable in full, every semester, upon registration unless the student has arranged for a deferred payment plan beforehand (for more details, see item 4 "Deferred Payment Plan").

The normal course load is 5 courses. Continuing students (not new students) who wish to take an overload (more than 5 courses), must petition the Academic Standards Committee in advance. Students allowed to take more than 5 courses will be charged an extra fee per course (for more details, see item "Tuition and Fees for Part-time Students").

The College reserves the right to adjust the tuition and fees for Spring 2011 if there is a significant rise in inflation.

#### Tuition and Fees for Part-time Students

Part-time students take up to 3 courses and pay €1,500.00 per course. The non-refundable Student Government Fee of €20.00 and a non-refundable service fee of €170.00 are charged. All other fees are also applicable for part-time students.

#### Methods of Payment

Payment may be presented in € by bank transfer or by credit card. After course enrolment and upon request, the Accounts Officer can provide you with an invoice stating the amount due.

##### 1. By Bank Transfer

***When transferring monies, please include the student's full name and specify the type of fee (for example Application Fee, Transfer Credit Fee, Tuition & Fees).***

##### 2. Transfer of Money From Abroad

Transferring money from abroad sometimes takes 2 or 3 months. It is important to retain proof of payment. To avoid problems, allow time for the payment to arrive before registration; at registration no bank orders will be accepted.

Students are liable for all bank charges, including exchange costs. In cases where Vesalius College pays these costs on behalf of the student, the student will be billed for the difference before the end of the semester.

##### 3. By Credit Card

Vesalius College accepts Eurocard/Mastercard and Visa. Should the credit card not be in the student's name, a written and signed permission from the cardholder must accompany the payment.

The application fee may be paid by credit card by completing the section "Application Fee" on the application form or by sending a letter authorizing the College to charge the amount to the credit card.

##### 4. Deferred Payment Plan

The deferred payment plan allows students to pay the tuition for each semester in two installments, rather than in a lump sum:

1) 60% of Tuition and Fees	3,150.00
2) 40% of Tuition and Fees	2,100.00

<sup>1</sup> An administrative fee of €25.00 for each payment is included.

Students who intend to pay in this way should notify the Accounts Officer each semester in writing and before they register.

Students whose payments are not in order are not allowed to register for the next semester, to take any examinations or to receive official documents or grades.

#### Estimated Costs other than Tuition and Fees

In addition to the tuition and fees that must be paid each semester, students should also budget for living costs. The following table shows a very rough estimate for some of these costs and may be of help in budgeting for the semester.
